
Washington Life Science Report – January 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Twinstrand Biosciences, a Seattle-based startup originally spun out from the University of Washington, raised a \$16M in a Series A funding round led by Madrona Venture Group. Twinstrand's DNA sequencing method, known as Duplex Sequencing, uses cloud technologies and advanced error-correction algorithms to find rare genetic variants with improved accuracy as compared to standard sequencing techniques. - Phase Genomics has been awarded a \$1.5M Phase II SBIR grant from the NIH National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease to support the development of a rapid antimicrobial resistance tracking kit using high-throughput chromatic conformation, or Hi-C, proximity ligation technology. Phase Genomics is a graduate of Life Science Washington Institute's WIN Mentoring Program. (Genome Web)
- <u>Frazier Healthcare Partners</u> announced the closure of a \$617M fund, also known at Frazier Life Sciences X. The fund will be used to invest in therapeutics-focused companies working to develop and commercialize biopharmaceuticals. Two-thirds of investments will go toward seed and series A fundraising rounds. (Geekwire)
